Context and Objectives of the EU-Sri Lanka Innovation Partnership (EU-SLIP)

The **EU** through the **EU delegation to Sri Lanka** launched a pilot project in early 2020 with the aim to foster innovation cooperation between Sri Lanka and Europe¹. Fostering partnerships with Sri Lanka's growing innovation and start-up ecosystem, is seen as an important tool to strengthening mutually beneficial EU-Sri Lankan collaboration.

The first EU-Sri Lankan innovation week took place in March 2020 during which the European and Sri Lankan stakeholders had the possibility to initiate collaboration.

Following the Innovation week, EU experts further engaged with the Sri Lankan enablers and startups in direct talks and through implementation of focus group discussions. These were aimed at understanding expectations, resources and commitment of enablers and supported startups when engaging in international partnerships and have been instrumental in the design of the EU-SLIP project as a means to provide concrete opportunities of collaboration.

Thus, the EU-Sri Lanka Innovation Partnership initiative is a consolidation of the different EU supports² that provides a great opportunity for Europe and Sri Lanka to foster research and innovation networks, and to collaborate in implementing incubation, acceleration and scaling up programs that can support start-ups from both sides to co-create and scale to the other region. Simultaneously, the Sri Lankan innovation ecosystem can further build up their capacity by benefiting from good practice examples and innovations from Europe.

To achieve the above objectives, the following three key activities will be implemented during the timespan of this pilot project:

- Creation of a Network of EU-Sri Lankan Incubators & Accelerators ;
- > Set up of an EU-South Asia Start up Help Desk and Hands on Support; and
- Facilitate Corporate and Investor Open Innovation and Tech Scouting

The European Commission, through the Support Facility, will carry out the following activities to support the collaboration of European and Sri Lankan incubators and accelerators:

Identify & reach out to incubators, accelerators and other relevant stakeholders from Europe and Sri Lanka with a specific interest in the other region. Incubators/accelerators will be matched by the team with counterparts in the other region focusing on similar thematic areas, facilitating mutual learning and exchange programmes. This way, a long-term network will be created, linking the key EU and Sri Lankan start-up ecosystems.

- ▷ Organise three networking events for incubators and accelerators which support start-ups that could benefit from this initiative. Each event brings together 10 representatives from incubators and accelerators (5 from each region), alongside other stakeholders.
- ⇒ Inspire incubators and accelerators to engage in further exchanges between their own staff and staff of their member start-ups. This includes support to create tailored incubator/accelerator exchange programmes.
- ⇒ Offer capacity building trainings that suit the needs of incubators and accelerators.
- ➡ Launch thematic challenges that facilitate the co-creation and collaboration of Sri Lankan and European start-ups.
- ⇒ Facilitate tech scouting by Corporates and Investors
- ⇒ **Encourage** start-up participation in relevant conferences and events in both regions.
- ⇒ Share information on various cross-border funding opportunities
- ⇒ **Establish** an EU-South Asia Start-up help desk for internationalization and new market entry.
- ⇒ **Prepare** a toolkit for internationalization that can be readily available for start-ups

1. Second Networking Event: objectives

The **EU-Sri Lanka Innovation Partnership (EU-SLIP)** second networking event will reconvene the 5 Sri Lankan and the 5 European incubators/accelerators that participated in the first EU-SLIP networking event in December 2020.

The key **objectives** of this event are threefold: (1) provide the incubators with the opportunity to present on the state of play of their partnerships and key milestones achieved since December 2020; (2) disseminate information on the EU-SLIP agri-tech thematic challenge, the EU-South Asia Help Desk and corporate engagement activities, and; (3) organise parallel training workshops that will suit the respective needs of the Sri Lankan and European incubators.

This event will also include a start-up pitch session as well as brief presentations given by corporates on their relevant third-party opportunities/open innovation calls for European and South Asian start-ups.

2. Timing, Location and Format

The second meeting will take place on **22 April 2021**, which should give the incubator pairs sufficient time to deepen their partnerships and realize concrete collaborations since the first EU-SLIP event in December 2020. In addition, between January and March 2021, peer exchange sessions with the support of the consultant Giordano Dichter have been held, aiming at facilitating the cooperation among each incubator pair.

Due to the current Covid-19 pandemic, this will be a **virtual event**. Given that this event will mostly entail presentations as well as a training workshop session, an interactive **workshop-style** is being envisaged.

3. Participants

The core group of participants are the representatives of the 5 Sri Lankan and 5 European incubators that participated in the December networking event as well as an Italian incubator, Lazio Innova, that has





recently joined the EU-SLIP incubator network. The list of incubators participating in this event can be found in section 7 below.

In addition, 5 start-ups and a selected number of corporates will also be invited to present for specific sessions during the event.

The facilitators of this event will be the EU-SLIP Service Facility team, which will comprise of 5 members to ensure effective support and organisation of the event.
