Study on European companies' data sharing

To whom it may concern,

Following up on its Communication of 10 January 2017 on "Building a European Data Economy", the European Commission decided to assess the economic value and potential of data sharing among independent economic operators in Europe, as well as the prevailing barriers and success factors in this regard.

To this end, the European Commission is currently carrying out a study to quantify data shared (and not shared) between companies, along with the missed business opportunities resulting from non-sharing data. This study is also aimed at understanding success factors of data sharing between economic operators. This will be the first comprehensive study that has ever been carried out in Europe to ascertain the economic and innovation potential of data sharing. The study will be conducted by the specialised consultancy *everis*.
